6. School Improvement Plan Goals / Trust Land Budget – Brad Chapple

a. Review Budget for 2022-2023: pass out hard copy to each member; it is also posted online; focus will be Math & 9<sup>th</sup> Grade credit. We want Millcreek students to grow up to be contributing members of society. (See budget handout in folder)

Goal 1: Millcreek students will demonstrate a 3% increase in growth in mathematics across all grade levels for the 2022-2023 academic school year. (money attached)

Goal 2: Increase the number of students in the class of 2026 that are on track to graduate by reducing the number of core classes failed by 3% when compared to their 8<sup>th</sup> grade year as measured by the graduation summary report. (money attached)

In addition to Personalized Learning Software, include Dreambox math learning software as a way to reduce failing math students, in addition to smartmusic and language arts. It is an adaptive software. (Paid by STEM grant for one year).

Goal 3: Continue to support social and emotional learning by holding a daily schoolwide SEL moment in RAP classes daily. (Preplanned topics on Mondays)

At Millcreek, our SEL is centered around character building.
