- 5. School Improvement Plan Goal Presentation- Brad Chapple: Data drives our program
 - a. SIP Goal #1: Millcreek students will demonstrate a 3% increase in proficiency in mathematics across all grade levels for the 2022-2023 academic school year. Measuring from SY2021 and improving for SY2023. (Math score to move from 46.3% to 49.3%) We are pulling data from district to find where we can grow specifically. Mr. Chapple will let the math teachers write the specific goal for next year. (Mr. Chapple addressed the reason why we are not a 5/5 school).
 - SIP Goal #2: Increase the number of students in the class of 2026 that are on track to graduate by reducing the number of classes failed by 3% when compared to their 8th grade year. (Comparing like data)
 - c. SIP Goal #3: Increase the number of students in the class of 2026 that are on track to graduate by reducing the number of classes failed by 3% when compared to their 8th grade year. (How are we teaching teachers to incorporate SEL into their classrooms)? Continue to support SEL by holding a daily schoolwide SEL moment in RAP classes daily.
 - d. Reviewed employee survey for spending funds to support goals. Mr. Chapple is going to present this at faculty meeting and will have the results for the next meeting.
