

BIOLOGY

- Space is limited for this class. It is recommended students have A's and B's in math and science, end of level test scores of 3 or 4 and enrolled in Secondary Math 1 Honors.
- You need a lot more math in chemistry and physics when you take these classes in 10th and 11th grade.

ENGINEERING CREDITS

- This course may also be taken to fulfill a third science credit requirement.
 - (Third science means that the other science classes must be foundation science classes. For Example: Earth Science, Biology, Chemistry, or Physics)
- If students take Engineering Principles 1 and 2 for the full year, they can earn 1.0 science credit. This class could be taken in place of Earth Science or Biology.
- This class can also be taken for Career and Technical Education (CTE) credit. This class can be taken for one semester or a full year depending on their graduation credit needs. Students may earn 0.5 (semester) or 1.0 (year) CTE credit.
- This is not a pre-requisite class for other engineering classes taught in the high school. However, it is a great opportunity for students to explore the engineering field by taking this introductory class.

- Solid reading and writing skills (Lexile >1200)
- Expect 30 min. of homework <u>daily</u>.
- Strong work ethic COMMITTED to doing your best!

- You earn 1.0 fine arts credit for Jazz band.

 You need to have a full year commitment to this class.
- Orchestra 1 is available to all students wishing to participate in orchestra, who do not have previous experience.

- This is the introduction class to the Computer Science Field.

- We will do our best to accommodate classes, but there are times you will have to give up certain honors or elective classes if you choose to take classes at the high school as a 9th grade student.






