### Welcome to Junior High

- Block schedule
- Eight class periods
- Each period is 80 minutes long
- RAP (Reading and Academic Progress) is 30 minutes long Monday-Thursday

# How does the Block Schedule work?

- A Day: periods 1, 2, 3, 4, RAP
- B Day: periods 5, 6, 7, 8, RAP
- No RAP on Fridays

#### **Dress Code**

- Shorts/skirts: can't be higher than 3 inches above your knee
- Pants: no holes above the knee

- You receive your locker in August.


#### **Electronic Devices**




### Integrated Grade 7 Math

- Math 7
  - Pathway to CE Math 1050 (12<sup>th</sup> grade)
- Math 7 Honors
  - Students accelerate through online curriculum
  - Pathway to CE Math 1050, AP Calculus, or AP Statistics (12<sup>th</sup> grade)

## Accelerated Math

 This course places students directly into integrated 8th grade mathematics. Acceleration provides an opportunity to take additional AP math courses in high school. On this track, students can take AP Calculus in 11th grade and AP Statistics in 12th grade and earn college credit.

#### MJH Math Placement Process

- Initially, all students will be enrolled in Integrated 7th Grade Mathematics.
- Prior to June 1st, 2019, MJH will examine data from 6th grade RISE scores and teacher recommendations to identify qualified students who will be given the Honors opportunity or the Accelerated Math class.
- In June, an email will be sent to parents to confirm their students math placement.

#### MJH Math Screener Test Information

- Students who wish to challenge their math placement must take a screener test. This test will assess mathematical knowledge and aptitude in three areas:
  - 1. proficiency of 6<sup>th</sup> grade math content,
  - 2. application of 6<sup>th</sup> grade math principles to real-life situations, and
  - 3. evidence of independent higher-level thinking.
- The math screener test will be offered two days in June.
  - Tuesday, June 11<sup>th</sup> or Thursday, June 20<sup>th</sup>
  - 9:00 a.m. in the main office

#### District Math Information

The following has been offered in past years, but because of funding cuts we do not know if we will be able to offer these options in the summer of 2019.

Students may challenge the 7th grade course by taking the on-line final. There is a \$45 fee. Passing the final with 85% or above will allow them to register for 8th grade math as a 7th grade student. They may only challenge the test once.

There is an opportunity during the summer for any student to accelerate by taking an on-line class. Any student may enroll in the summer classes and there are no testing pre-qualifications. However, the students must pass the summer class with 85% or higher to register for 8th Grade Honors Math during their 7th grade year. 
This school year is not the only opportunity for students to accelerate their math education. Students may take summer math classes up to Secondary Math III.



- If students cannot do this, we ask that you take a keyboarding class in 7<sup>th</sup> grade.
- We have placed students in Keyboarding based on their Term 2 typing test. Typing test instructions are in your packet if students would like to earn a higher score.

# Music Exploration/ Beginning Choir

- Percussion Test: Thursday, March 7<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 p.m. in room 106. Must have TWO years of piano to be considered for the percussion class.

# Beginning Fitness 7

- This is a FUN class!!
- Students are required to take this class for a semester, but can also take it for a <u>full year</u> if they enjoy P.E.
- Uniform of white shirt and black shorts.
- You change and have a combination locker to keep your clothes and belongings safe.
- You do different sports, fitness days and the mile run.
- You are not required to shower, but need to clean up after class.

# World Language

- We offer one World Language: Spanish
